Preventive Health & Clinical Practice Guideline Updates (Medicaid, Marketplace, Medicare)

Preventive Health Guidelines (PHG) can benefit providers and their patients. Guidelines are based on scientific evidence, a review of the medical literature, or appropriately established authority, as cited. All recommendations are based on published consensus guidelines and do not favor any particular treatment based solely on cost considerations. These guidelines are meant to recommend a standard level of care and do not preclude the delivery of additional preventive services depending on the individual needs of the patient.

Clinical Practice Guidelines (CPG) are based on scientific evidence, a review of the medical literature, or appropriately established authority, as cited. All recommendations are based on published consensus guidelines and do not favor any treatment based solely on cost considerations. The care recommendations are suggested as guides for making clinical decisions. Clinicians and their patients must work together to develop individual treatment plans that are tailored to the specific needs and circumstances of each patient.
